

LOVE NEVER FAILS

Dear Church Family,

A number of years ago in the midst of conflict with a person in church and struggles with leading my Elder Board, the church, and the staff, I felt totally overwhelmed. God seemed to be challenging me to lead, and I wanted to tell Him to get someone else — like Moses told the Lord to do in Exodus. To complicate things even more, I was just recovering from the *Epstein-Barr* virus that had put me down for nine months, and I felt stressed out just trying to be a good husband to my wife and a great dad to my kids.

It was in this highly stressful environment that I learned one of the greatest lessons of my life. In my quest for answers from the Lord and in my search of Scriptures to find healing for my wounds and strength to go on, I ended up in 1 Corinthians 13. As I read Paul's famous love chapter, the words of Verse 8 jumped out at me as God's answer to all my pleas throughout the previous few months and His truth that I could find strength to keep going. The words "love never fails" were to me like finding out my grandfather just left me millions of dollars or that I had strength again like in my 20's!

"That's it," I thought to myself. Even if I felt like I was failing and even though others insinuated I was failing and even though I wanted to quit like a failure, I was guaranteed not to fail if I loved. So I thought to myself, people may be causing me trouble in my conflicts as a leader; kids may be stressful for me to lead; I might feel pressure from staff and elders, but no one is stopping me from loving. Even my bad health at that time couldn't stop me from loving. My position as a pastor, my emotional discouragement — nothing could make me a failure if I decide I will love.

That day was a huge turning point for me. I dedicated myself from that day until the day I die to love — no matter what.

That was more than twenty years ago, and I've been brought to much greater health, much stronger leadership, and have seen God do amazing things in my life. I sign my letters with the words "love never fails." I preach about it, and most importantly, I target love in all I do and say. Oh, I miss the target from time to time, but through the years, the Lord has improved my aim. And at least now, I'm aiming at the same target as the Lord so He is keeping me on target.

I've been through lots more conflicts and lots more stressful situations, but it's very different now because I

aim at love even if I have to deliver stern words or take a firm stand. Love, I now realize, "covers a multitude of my sins." In other words, people can hear me and follow my lead if I truly love them.


It was a few years later that I read Romans 5:5 where it says, "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit who has been given to us," which I now realize gives us the love we just don't feel for others. You see, the Lord can actually give you concern, affectionate feelings, commitment, and even desire to love if you aim at loving as He instructs us to do.

I hope this little story of part of my spiritual journey is helpful to you. I can absolutely say if I ever get to meet you, I'll love you because that's my aim and God puts love in my heart for everyone I meet. He can do it for you too. He wants to. Do you?

If you're not in a miniChurch or other small group and want to follow the series then join a Plug-in Group!




WHY PLUG-IN GROUPS?



WHAT IS ALPHA?

Alpha is a series of interactive sessions that explore the basics of the Christian faith. It's a place where you can explore what you believe in a safe, open environment. Alpha is fun, and that's why over 25 million people worldwide have attended Alpha.

MINISTRY PROFILE: MOM'S TIME OUT



“I was battling a severe case of postpartum depression,” said Danielle Adams. “I was in a season of life where I felt so alone, sad, guilty for my feelings, and a million other emotions that weren’t healthy. I needed help and support from someone who understood and was not judgmental. I needed to hear that I was going to be okay and that I was being a good mom. I needed to know in this crazy job of motherhood that I had loving support from people who just ‘got it.’”

When Danielle’s son, Chase, was only a few weeks old, a dear friend told her about a ministry at church called Mom’s Time Out (MTO). Danielle was excited to hear about it but nervous about bringing her newborn.

She added, “When Chase turned six months old, I was feeling even more depressed and alone than ever. Then during announcements at church one Sunday I learned that MTO was starting soon. I felt convicted to register. I went home and told my husband I was going ‘to a church thing for moms.’ Three weeks later, I attended my first MTO meeting and have loved going ever since.”

At Mom’s Time Out, Danielle found the support she was begging God to give her. She realized she wasn’t the only one who suffered postpartum depression. She found loving friends who prayed for her and her son, and she felt safe to be honest and real about what she was battling.

“Not only did I find such amazing friends, I also found a little piece of solitude,” said

Danielle. “It’s a place where no one judges, and we are all in the same boat. Some moms have babies, some have school aged kids, some even have grown children; but we are all called ‘Mom’ from someone. That makes us all sisters in the same walk of life. There is just something about that fact that gives a good feeling to my soul.”

Danielle’s been participating in MTO for two years, and her only regret is that she didn’t start going to Mom’s Time Out sooner when her sweet friend first invited her. She truly believes MTO was a Godsend and life saver not just for her, but her family.

“We all know when mama is happy, everyone is happy!” laughed Danielle. “Also Mom’s Time Out is a great place to have a cup (or two) of coffee without having to hear ‘mommy’ screamed 20 times!”

MTO Coordinator, Michele Fleckenstein, would agree with Danielle. “We can listen, share, and pray for each other without the distraction of our children,” said Michele.



"MTO is wonderful because it gives moms a chance to connect with other moms who are in the same season of life. I'm so thankful for this ministry because I've journeyed through motherhood with some of my closest friends!"

Michele has been coming to Mom's Time Out for 10 years. She started attending when her oldest daughter was born, and she's never left. "I attended for a short while and then I became a Discussion Group Leader (DGL)," Michele added. "For the last six years, I've been the MTO Coordinator. I've always liked to be a 'behind-the-scene' type of girl, but God had other plans. With the help of a great team of women, we plan the semester and rely on God to provide the moms and put all the details together!"

Michele is thankful for the numerous people who have dedicated their time to help make the Mom's Time Out ministry a success. It's difficult to name all the volunteers, but some of the women on the MTO team include:

Mom's Time Out has had a huge impact on Renee's life. It has allowed her to have true friendships with such incredible women. "They are some of my closest friendships!" said Renee. "The days I have MTO always tend to be one of the best days of my week!"

MTO participant, Danielle Adams, added, "The leaders really care about all of us moms, and you can tell how much work and love goes into every semester. I look forward to every meeting. Now wherever I go when I see a mom, I have to stop them and ask, 'Excuse me. Have you been to Mom's Time Out? You need to!' I believe in my heart that this is a place that every mom needs to be. I'm so thankful for the entire MTO team who musters up every semester the energy and resources to bless us once more."

MTO Coordinator, Michele, says that prayer is the foundation of Mom's Time Out: "We need prayer for the moms who are registered and for those who are going

to register," Michele added. "Pray for the health of the speakers, the moms, and the children who will be attending. Pray for the relationships that will develop at the tables and for the Discussion Group Leaders. Pray that these women will know and be reminded how much God loves them and wants a relationship with them."•

God@Work in the Life of *David Henry*



Three years ago, we shared the story of David and Heather Henry when David recounted how he had been touched and changed by the Angel Tree Ministry. (You can see David's story at [myfac.org/resources; God@Work](http://myfac.org/resources/God@Work) stories.)

Not long ago David was in church when Pastor Jim spoke about Alpha. God made it quite clear to David's wife, Heather, whom she should invite — a neighbor who had been through a horrible divorce. Heather's friend attended Alpha with her and after the sessions were over, the group decided they wanted to stay together and form a miniChurch. It was agreed that one of the men should lead it.

"I agreed to host it but not to lead it," David recalls. "I did not read the Bible on my own. I barely did the homework for the men's Catalyst Group. I don't pray in front of people. Speaking in public makes me break out in a sweat and almost faint. I actually got up and walked out of Sunday school when I was asked to pray. There was no way I could lead a miniChurch, and I wouldn't even consider it."

Two months passed and about eight people still wanted that miniChurch. Heather began making calls to other miniChurches to see if those people could join their groups. In spite of all this, David says, "I said 'no' again!"

Within three days and literally multiple people asking about a miniChurch, David "felt God do more than tug at me. I kept saying no. Finally, Heather said, 'I think you should consider this and pray about it.'" So that's what he did. He contacted Pastor Dave Krilov, filled out the application, "and

started losing sleep! Why was I doing this? I couldn't do this! I don't know enough. I don't pray enough. I have never led anything. I can't do this!"

That very same week, David's men's group was turning into a Timothy Project. He came home that first night and told Heather he was dropping out because he still wasn't sure he could lead a miniChurch. Heather said, "Or maybe the Timothy Project is getting you ready for miniChurch?" David and Heather sat down together and did his first little Bible study. He didn't quit Timothy Project.

do any of these things, but God has blessed my obedience. My wife has noticed a humility in me that was not there before. I used to be so prideful that Heather would joke she needed to pop my head so it would fit through the door!

"I am no different than any other man. I was insecure about my relationship with God. I even questioned if I would go to heaven if I died. I would become defensive around my wife if she made any comment about my spiritual life. We would never have conversations about God. Well, all that has changed now.

"I am grateful for the opportunity to watch firsthand the people in our miniChurch change and grow closer to God. I feel honored to be a part of such an amazing group of Christians, and we get to be blessed through them. We have wonderful, miracle-type things happening in our group. Because I was obedient, God was gracious enough to use me — and I was and am not deserving of it at all! I am the one being blessed by all of this."

David knows that he is a changed man. "I have never been an academic so that was always my excuse for not studying the Bible. Now, I have to, I want to, I need to, and the Holy Spirit has filled me, helped me, and loved me."

As Pastor Marty has preached, it only takes one person in a family to change the family, and David has proof of that! "There has been a difference in my teenage son's spiritual life since I was changed — a noticeable difference in him." God is not done yet!

"We are grateful and humbled. I wanted others to know these things because I can relate to so many men who have a wife or other women in their life who are stronger Christians than they are. It is uncomfortable to be in that situation, and so many men get stuck there. I was for many years.

Obedying, submission, trust, and humility were all things I needed to learn. God has been working on every one of these things and He is blessing us abundantly."•

"I literally felt the Holy Spirit come over me."

David says, "That very weekend, Pastor Marty spoke about the Holy Spirit and fire. I sat in that sermon and for the first time in my life, I literally felt the Holy Spirit come over me. It was a physical feeling I had never had prior to that. It changed me. The Holy Spirit helped me, encouraged me, and made it possible for me to read and understand the Bible. He has made it possible for me to speak in front of people and He made it possible for me to pray in front of people. Our miniChurch is now up to 17 people!

"It was such a change in me that my daughter, Sarah, age 17, asked if I was dying because I was acting so differently. I apologized for things for which I needed to apologize. I told my father-in-law how much he meant to me, began doing my homework, and even more amazing — I have spent hours reading and listening to sermons and preparing for miniChurch and the Timothy Project.

"I have learned more about Jesus in these past few months than probably in my entire adult life. I didn't want to obey. It is completely unlike me to
